- How much PILOT money will the Town actually be able to keep?

What we're being told is that this is all about saving the planet from global warming and bringing much-needed revenue to our poor local economy. But who will be making money and how much? We need to know and deserve clear answers before any more decisions are made. Yes, but not only money influences politics, you might say, power does too.
